

Dell XPS15z, Latitude 3350 cheat sheet

Changing F1-F12 key behaviors

Like many laptops, Dell laptops allow you to change F1-F12 key behavior. These keys can behave like multimedia keys or usual function keys.

To change this, you need to access the BIOS. In the BIOS, look for an option similar to "Function key behavior". On some systems, this option can sometimes be found in Control Panel. You can check if this option found under Mobility Center (Dell usually inserts this option there).

Fn + F7	Toggles between external displays and/or the internal LCD
Fn + F8	Search (Windows 8 onwards)
Fn + F11	Decrease LCD Brightness
Fn + F12	Increase LCD Brightness
Print Screen	Toggle Wireless (Wi-Fi) On/Off
Insert	Enter Sleep / Hibernation mode
Left arrow	Home
Right arrow	End

XPS15z: Special functions

These shortcuts are valid in Latitude, XPS, Inspiron 15z 5523, XPS 15Z L511Z.

Fn + F1	Extend desktop
Fn + F2	Switch wireless radios on/off
Fn + F3	Disable/Enable touchpad
Fn + F4	Decrease display brightness
Fn + F5	Increase display brightness
Fn + F6	Toggle keyboard backlight

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XPS15z: Multimedia keys

These shortcuts are valid in Latitude, XPS, Inspiron 15z 5523, XPS 15Z L511Z.

Fn + F8	Rewind or play previous track
Fn + F9	Play or pause
Fn + F10	Forward or play next track
Fn + F11	Decrease volume
Fn + F12	Increase volume
Mute	Mute sound playback

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Fn + Esc	Activates Function Key Lock
Fn + F1	Mute Audio
Fn + F2	Decrease Volume
Fn + F3	Increase Volume
Fn + F4	Toggle Microphone On/Off
Fn + F5	Toggle Number Lock On/Off (Enabled in BIOS, for using embedded numeric keys)
Fn + F6	Enable or Disable Scroll Lock
