

MuPDF cheat sheet

General

Left arrow / Right arrow or H or J or K or L	Navigate
--	----------

Note: Even if the page is horizontal only J and K will change page.

J and K will align the bottom (or the top) of the page with the bottom (or the top) of the window before changing page

Right arrow or Space	Next page (don't change placement of the page)
----------------------	--

Left arrow or B or Backspace	Previous page (don't change placement of the page)
------------------------------	--

. or ,	Next/Previous page (align the top or bottom of the page with the top or bottom of the window)
--------	---

> or <	Skip forth/back 10 pages
--------	--------------------------

[1 - 9] then G or numrow then Enter	Go to page
-------------------------------------	------------

Will go to the first page with no number.

+	Zoom in
---	---------

= or -	Zoom out

(note that zooming is restricted to certain 'levels' only - 18, 24, 36, 54, 72, 96, 120, 144, 180, 216 and 288 dpi)

Shift + L	Rotate 90° counterclockwise

Shift + R	Rotate 90° clockwise

Shift + W	Fit to width
-----------	--------------

Shift + H	Fit to height

Shift + Z	Autofit (fit to height if the page is vertical, to width if the page is horizontal)

W	Resize window to fit the page

F	Fullscreen

/	Search forward

?	Search backward

N	Next search term

Shift + N	Previous search term

Shift + I	Invert colors

R	Reload the page
Q	Quit
